“ I remember Mr Carter well because he was my bus driver 6 years. I was usually the last or one of the last kids to get on the bus in the morning and usually the last one to get off in the afternoon. I also remember him helping out as janitor at Toney Jr High while it was open and he always had that big set of keys on his belt. He always tried to be fair to the kids on the bus as long as we did what he said and didn't tear up the bus. Some kids thought he was a mean old man but that's because they were the ones tearing up the bus. You wouldn't be able to do it today but I do remember him stopping the bus on Hwy 53 once and putting about 4 or 5 teenagers off the bus and making them walk home. I remember another time we had to evacuate the bus because of an electrical fire. He was very calm and everyone got off unhurt. If I didn't already have grandparents alive then he would have been someone I would have gladly adopted as my granddad. Maybe I did and just didn't realize it until now. He touched a lot of lives and I bet if adults today really looked back they would thank Mr Carter for getting them to school and home safely every day. I know I do. God Bless.
