Janet Nutt Lundgren, 85, of Madison, Alabama, formerly of Paramus, New Jersey and Schenectady, New York, died on February 19, 2016 in Huntsville, Alabama. Born August 3, 1930 in Hackensack, New Jersey, she was the daughter of the late James Norwell Nutt, Sr. and the late Jessie Hutchison Nutt. A graduate of Westwood High School (NJ) and Drexel Institute of Technology, she met chemist Daniel Paul Lundgren of Brockton, Massachusetts through Tall Clubs International. They married in June 1954 and raised their family in Paramus. Jan taught Home Economics at Maywood High School (NJ) and retired as guidance secretary from Paramus High School.
