My daughter this past year of 9-10 years old cried day after day because she had to get off the bus alone after they changed the time schedules for elementary and middle school. Mrs.Sharp calmed Alondra and waited for her to get off the bus and open the door and get inside before she drove away. Mrs.Sharp made her feel safe. She cared for them as if they were her own. Antonio also came to me the day that Mrs.Sharp returned to the bus and he said that she had cut her hair very very short and that she told them that she had gotten cancer and that she may be unable to drive the bus for a while. She was out for a good while then she came back the week of Valentines and said she was going to try to be back the next week if she wasn't too weak. So on Friday the kids brought her bouquet of flowers for Valentines and they were sad to see that she did not return on Monday. She tried as hard as she could. She came back to the bus a day here and a day there. But I just told the kids that she may just be too weak. They had big hopes to see her at the wheel of the bus this upcoming school year.
